## Preventing violence against children deprived of liberty: the cases of Benin and Uruguay

## Wednesday, 7<sup>th</sup> March 2012 14hoo — 16hoo Room XXIII, Palais des Nations

Since 2009, in partnership with two members of its SOS-Torture Network (IELSUR and ESAM), OMCT has implemented a project in Benin and Uruguay that aims at further protecting children deprived of liberty through, among other activities, developing monitoring visits of detention facilities by NGOs, training professionals on specific measures of prevention of violence against children in conflict with the law and deprived of liberty, and advocating State authorities.

On the occasion of the Human Rights Council's full-day meeting on the rights of the child that will this year focus on children and the administration of justice, the side event will provide an opportunity to address situations of violence against children deprived of liberty and discuss strategies to prevent such violence, including by monitoring detention facilities. The side event will also tackle challenges related to such monitoring and highlight good practices, notably in Benin and Uruguay, that could be replicated in other countries and regions. The presentations will be followed by a discussion with the audience
