

## COMPLAINTS WORKSHOP



The OMCT Complaints Training Workshop will take place 10-12 July 2007 at the OMCT Secretariat in Geneva, Switzerland. The aim of the workshop is to equip participants with the knowledge, skills and understanding that will enable them to prepare and successfully litigate cases involving violations of the prohibition of torture and ill-treatment before the United Nations Human Rights Committee and Committee against Torture. To this end, the workshop will gather NGO advocates from around the world in a small group setting for an interactive 3 day litigation training session. Taking full advantage of OMCT's location in Geneva, participants will benefit from the contributions of leading experts in the field of human rights including academics, practitioners, UN personnel and OMCT staff. Interactive group discussions, case studies and skills-development exercises will further hone participants litigation skills. The trainings will be based on Volume 4 of the OMCT Handbook Series: Seeking Remedies for Torture Victims: a Handbook for Victims and their Advocates. The book is a practical guide covering most of the topics which will be addressed during the workshop.
